Dear LCDC Chief Officer,

The Department of Health's Mental Health Unit has designed a once-off programme in recent months to support local level initiatives that promote and enhance mental health and well-being. The Community Mental Health Fund (CMHF) has an allocation of €2.79m and is being made available to support actions to improve the mental health and well-being of people in the community and to tackle loneliness and isolation. In addition, the Fund seeks to support innovative actions that promote collaboration and partnership with formal mental health and suicide prevention services and to co-ordinate and implement related activities in local community settings.

As mental health is one of 6 themes under the Healthy Ireland Fund (HIF) Round 3, and the CMHF is closely aligned to HIF, a decision has been made to channel CMHF funding to each local authority (and CYPSC) via the HIF Round 3 programme framework. As a result, I am pleased to inform **Waterford City & County Council** has been allocated an additional **€62,050** for ring-fenced activity under the HIF mental health theme. Each CYPSC will receive a separate allocation of €32,050.

Please note the following in relation to the CMHF allocation and eligible activities.

- Of the €62,050 allocation, €30,000 must be made available to local community, voluntary and sporting organisations via a small grants scheme, with the balance of €32,050 to be used to support innovative actions that promote collaboration and partnership with formal mental health and suicide prevention services and to co-ordinate and implement activities in local community settings. Regional actions are particularly welcomed under the Fund.
- The small grants scheme to be implemented by each Local Authority during the lifetime of HIF Round 3 will allow funding of €2,000-€5,000 to be provided to between 6 and 15 local organisations. The Local Authority will be responsible for all reporting to Pobal/Department of Health on the expenditure in relation to the small grants scheme. Refer to the updated HIF Guidelines v1.3 for further information.
- Eligible activities must correspond with what is eligible under the HIF Mental Health theme and demonstrate the contribution to the relevant national policy for the theme. Activities could include, for example:
  - Wellbeing activities
  - Actions supporting the implementation of 'Connecting for Life'\*
  - Mental Health training through partnerships/collaboration
  - Social prescribing
  - Creative arts programmes
  - Play programmes
  - Educational initiatives
  - Initiatives to improve living well with a chronic condition
  - Family Support projects
  - Infant and children's mental health initiatives
  - Social farming programmes
- Each LCDC can add 2 actions to their HIF Programme of Work under the mental health theme to reflect this additional allocation. One action should relate to delivery of the small grants scheme, while a second action should relate to activities that promote collaboration and partnership with formal mental health and suicide prevention services and to co-ordinate and implement activities in local community settings. As referenced above, regional initiatives that involve working in partnership with other local authorities are welcomed.
- Grantees will need to go to the [HIF Portal](#), 'Useful Documents' section, 'Round 3' Folder to download an updated *HIF Round 3 Strand 1 Programme of Work Template v.2.0* and relevant *HIF Budget Template*, which have been updated to include specific reference to the Community Mental Health Fund. If you are experiencing any difficulties accessing the HIF Portal contact [onlinesupport@pobal.ie](mailto:onlinesupport@pobal.ie)
- The HIF Round 3 programme of work (POW) template will now include a maximum of 5 HIF funded actions and 2 CMHF funded actions. The POW is due for submission on or before 20<sup>th</sup> September 2019.
- An addendum to your HIF grant agreement will issue once your POW is approved, and this will reflect your additional allocation.

Further guidance on the Community Mental Health Fund has been included in the document '*HIF Guidelines Strand 1 Final 20082019 V1.3*'. Refer specifically to *Section 12: Additional Funding: Healthy Ireland Fund Round 3 – Thematic Area: Mental Health*. This replaces the document '*HIF Guidelines Strand 1 Final 23072019 V.1.2*' on the Portal. A copy of the Guidelines has been attached to this correspondence and is also available on the HIF Portal.

Please note that the indicative ineligible costs as outlined in section 8.8 of these guidelines also apply to the CMHF. However, the following costs are also ineligible under the CMHF:

- Salary costs associated with the delivery of the Small Grants Scheme.

- The backfill costs of a position, if secondment takes place within the LCDC or council.
- Any contribution towards the administration of the CMHF action.
- Any contribution towards the Healthy Ireland Co-ordinator's salary and associated employment and equipment costs.

**Subject:** Public Consultation on Rural Development Policy 2020+

Dear Chief Officers,

In the context of the development of the successor to the Action Plan for Rural Development, we have held a series of consultation events over the last number of months to obtain stakeholder views on the challenges and opportunities facing rural Ireland. Several other events are planned, and consultations with Departments and agencies are on-going.

Following on from these events, we are now inviting wider public feedback, through an online survey. The Survey was launched yesterday by Minister Ring and will remain open until **Friday 11 October 2019**. As part of the Dormant Accounts Fund (DAF) Action Plan for 2018, the Department of Rural and Community Development (DRCD) is inviting grant applications to provide Training and Mentoring Supports for Social Enterprises.

The Department of Rural and Community Development (DRCD) recently announced a new DAF Measure with €800,000 in funding for the provision of training and mentoring supports for social enterprises throughout Ireland.
