Ballybeg	‘Ballybeg- A Healthy Community’ (1 on the map) Upgrading Ballybeg Greens facilities would provide a communal meeting area, improved security, affordable access to materials and other equipment, improved fencing and footpaths. Extra 25 allotments for the local residents/families, training (including HFME), cookery classes etc. Provision of seeds and Vegetable boxes will be included in the training. ETB will provide the training and seeds will be sourced from GYI or other organisations. There were 4 meetings with the FRC manager and one with the Head Grower. Proposal was made based on the FRC identified needs and the food poverty in the community. Lisduggan Larchville	Central Avenue Green, Lisduggan (2) A development on the green with paths, planting and trees in order to develop the space into a positive area. The area was previously neglected and used as a dumping ground. The second phase will do soft landscaping, planting flowers, shrubs, trees, benches etc. Please see drawings attached. The need was identified by the Estate Tenancy Manager during consultation with the local community and residents associations. I had 3 meetings with Michael and one with the residents association. We can set up a Pilot Project after consultations with locals about their needs and how to go about it, record everything and evaluate the impact. St John's Park	Butlers Community Centre (6) The centre is planning for few activities including extension of the allotments and provision of a gardening/horticulture training (ETB), the development of a Sensory Garden and Womens Health Initiative. I had several meetings with the Centre manager prior to the proposal. Request for funding at this stage is only for: Womens Health Initiative A series of 8 workshops with guest speakers covering a range of health issues like: Heart Disease, Breast Cancer, Ovarian and Cervical Cancer, Gynaecological Health, Depression and Anxiety, Health Technology for Women, Nutrition, Mindfulness. We can work with HSE HP in sourcing medical professionals for the workshops. Expenses are for a facilitator, room rental, tea & coffee, projector and are shared with Butler Community Centre.
