Figure 1 Individual registrations at national level, by year

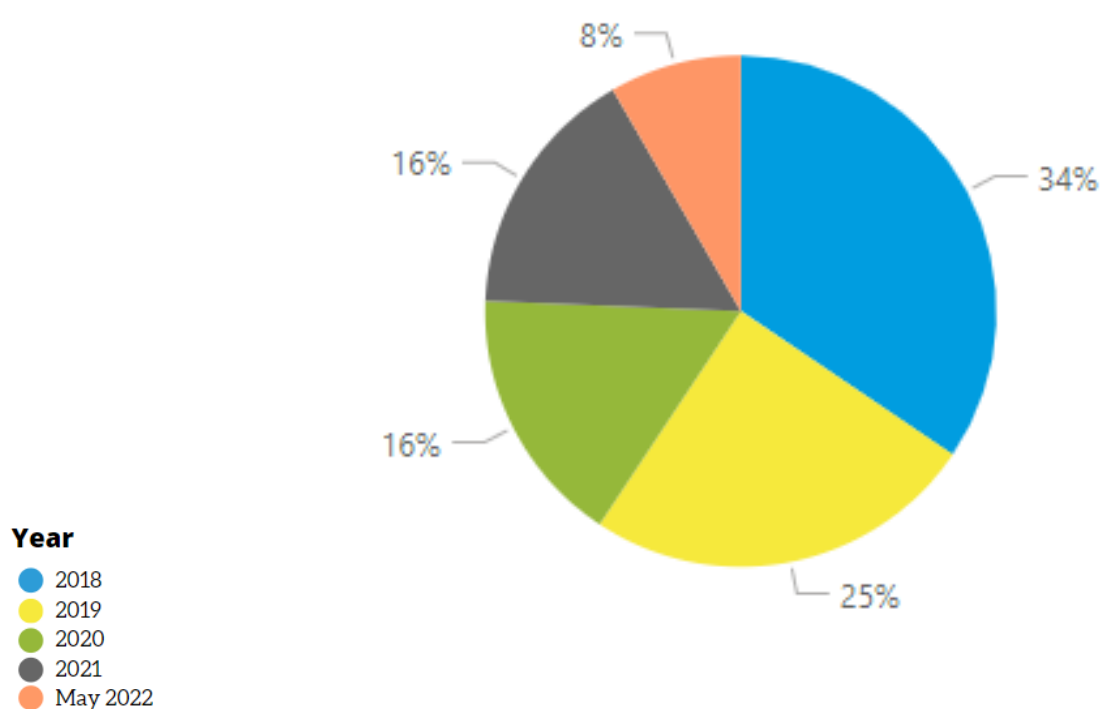
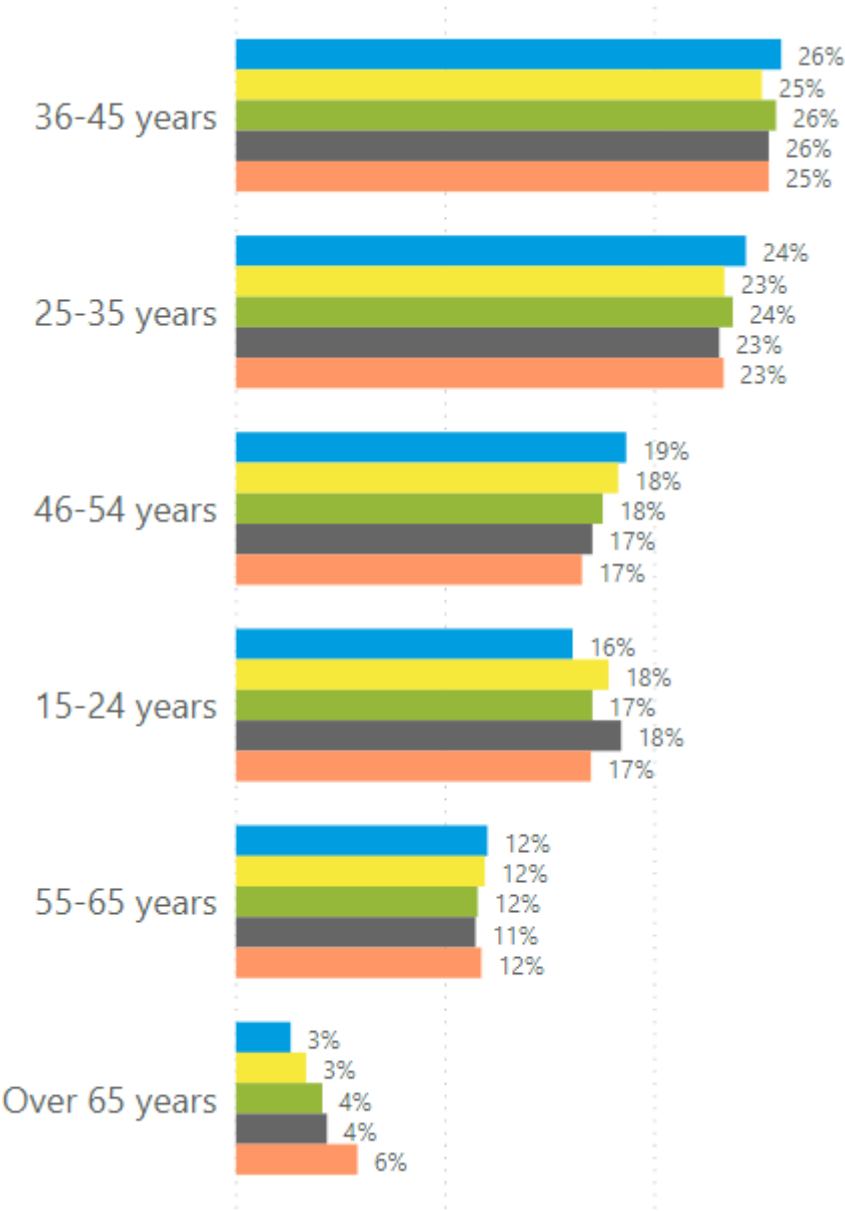


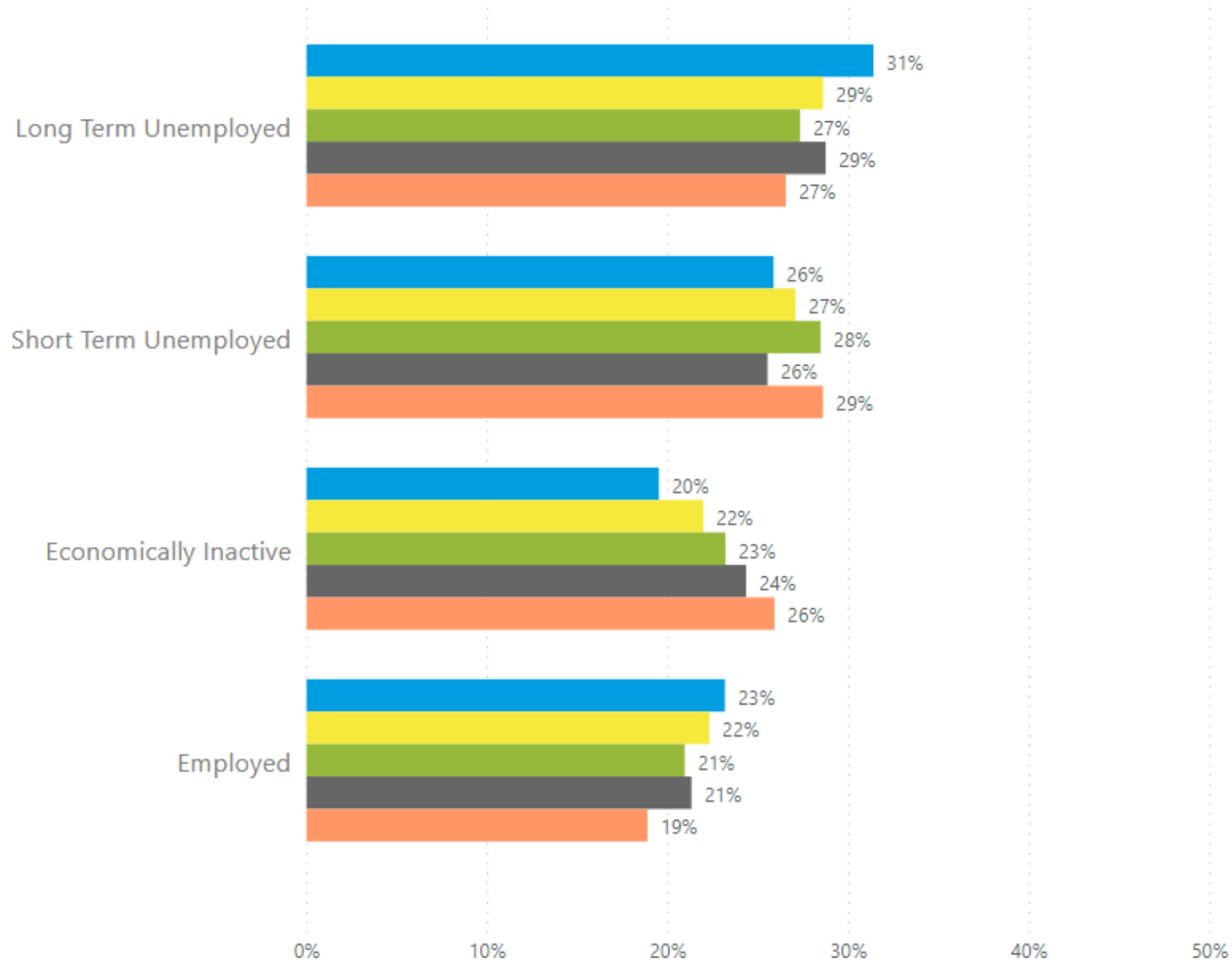
Figure 2 Individuals on the 2018 – May 2022 caseloads at national level, by age band

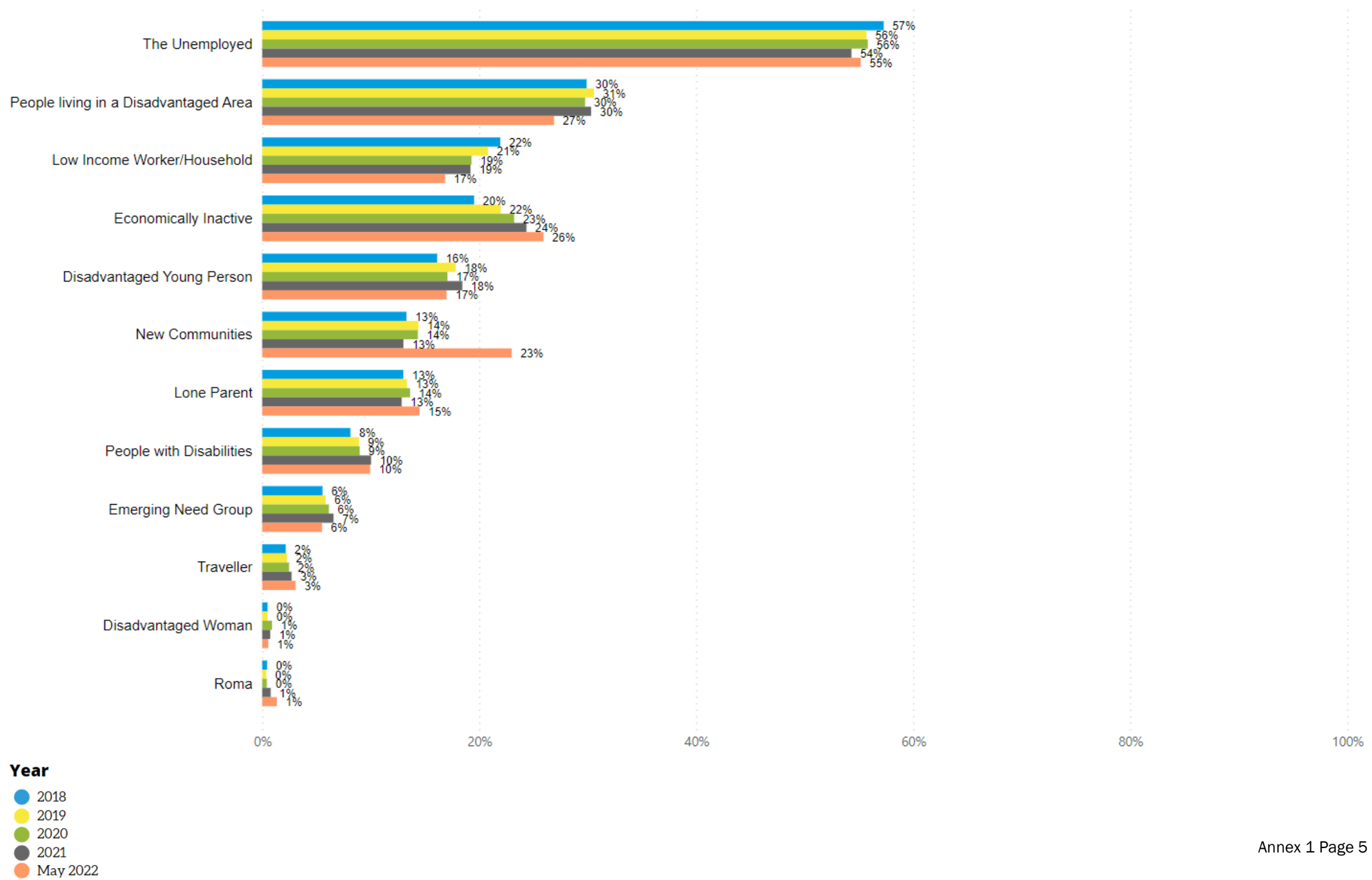
Figure 3 Individuals on the 2018 – May 2022 caseloads at national level, by principal economic status

Figure 6 Distance Travelled Tool at national level, by numbers completed

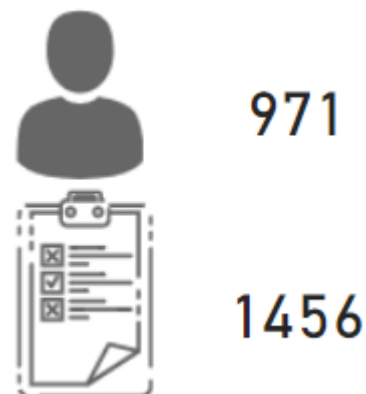
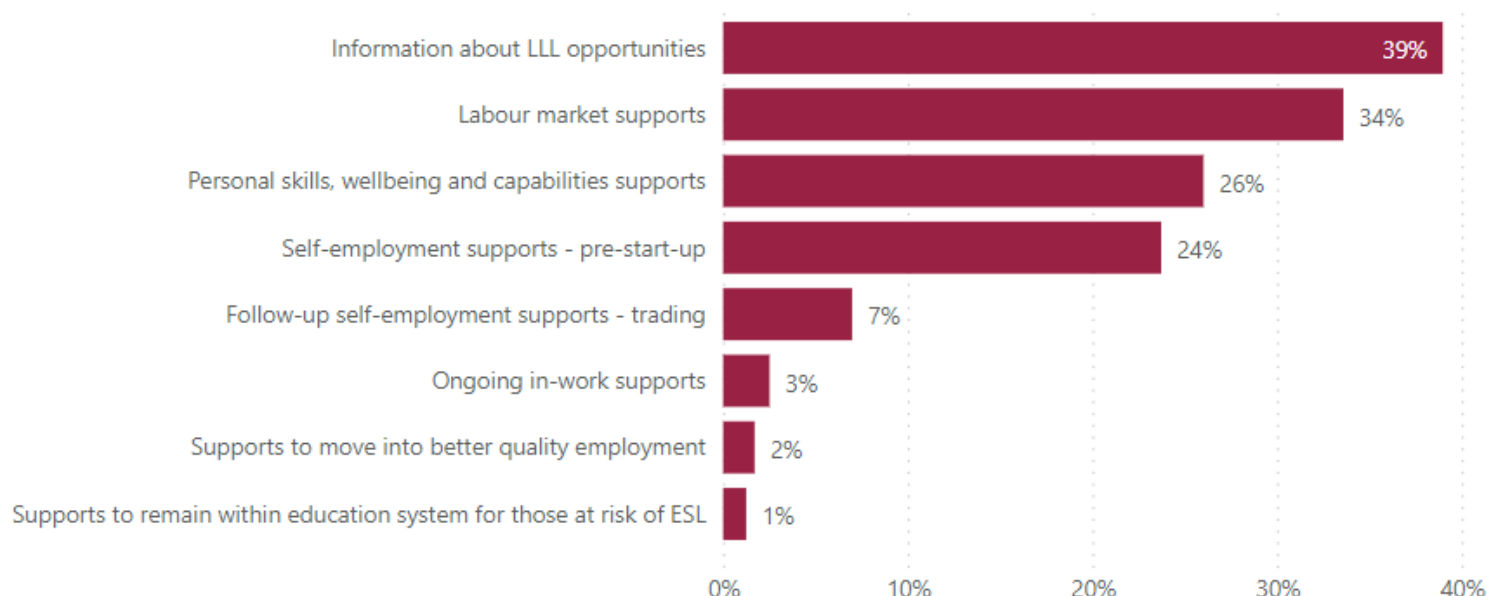


Figure 7 Individuals on the caseload at national level to date, by type of interventions² received

Figure 8 Individuals on the caseload at national level to date, by type of outputs achieved

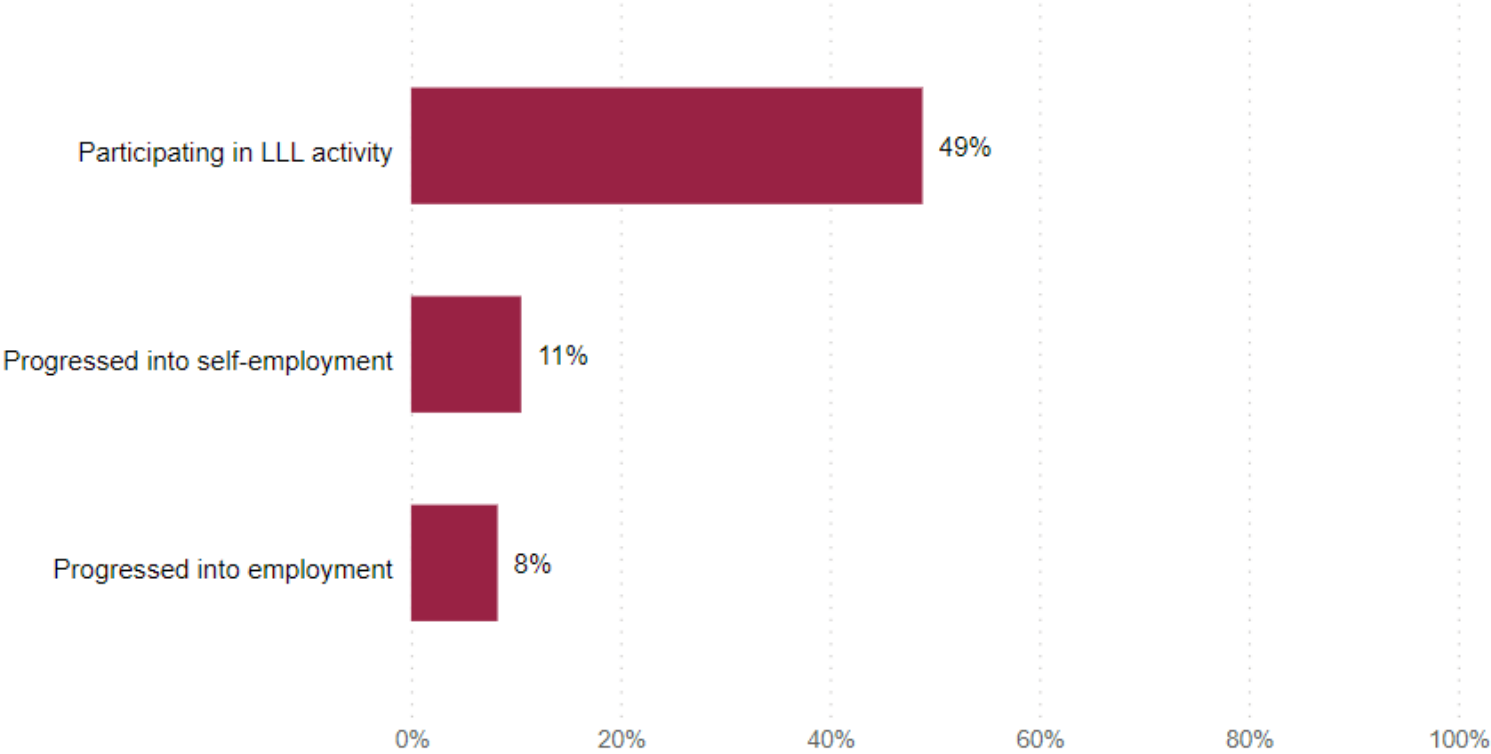

Figure 9 LCG registrations at national level, by year

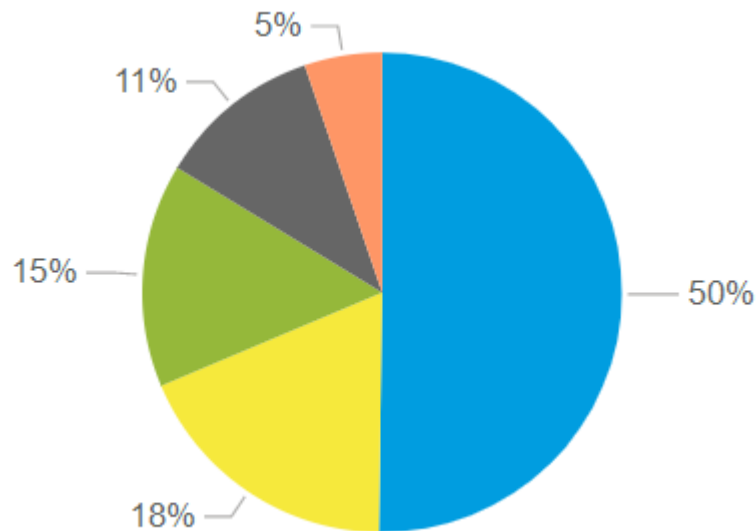


Figure 10 Total LCGs on the 2018 – May 2022 caseloads at national level, by type

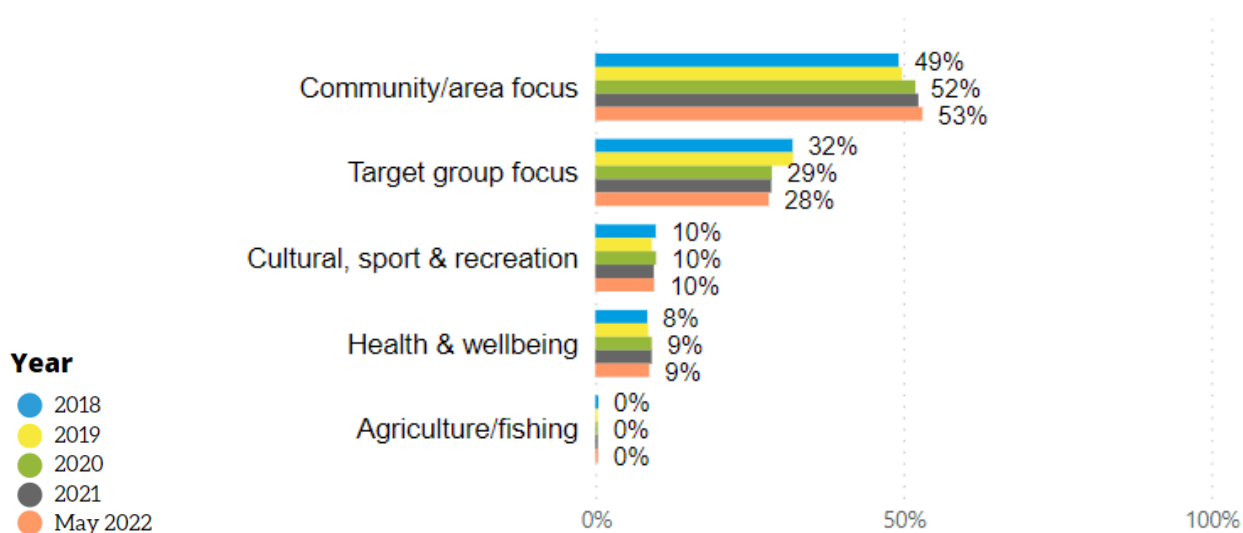
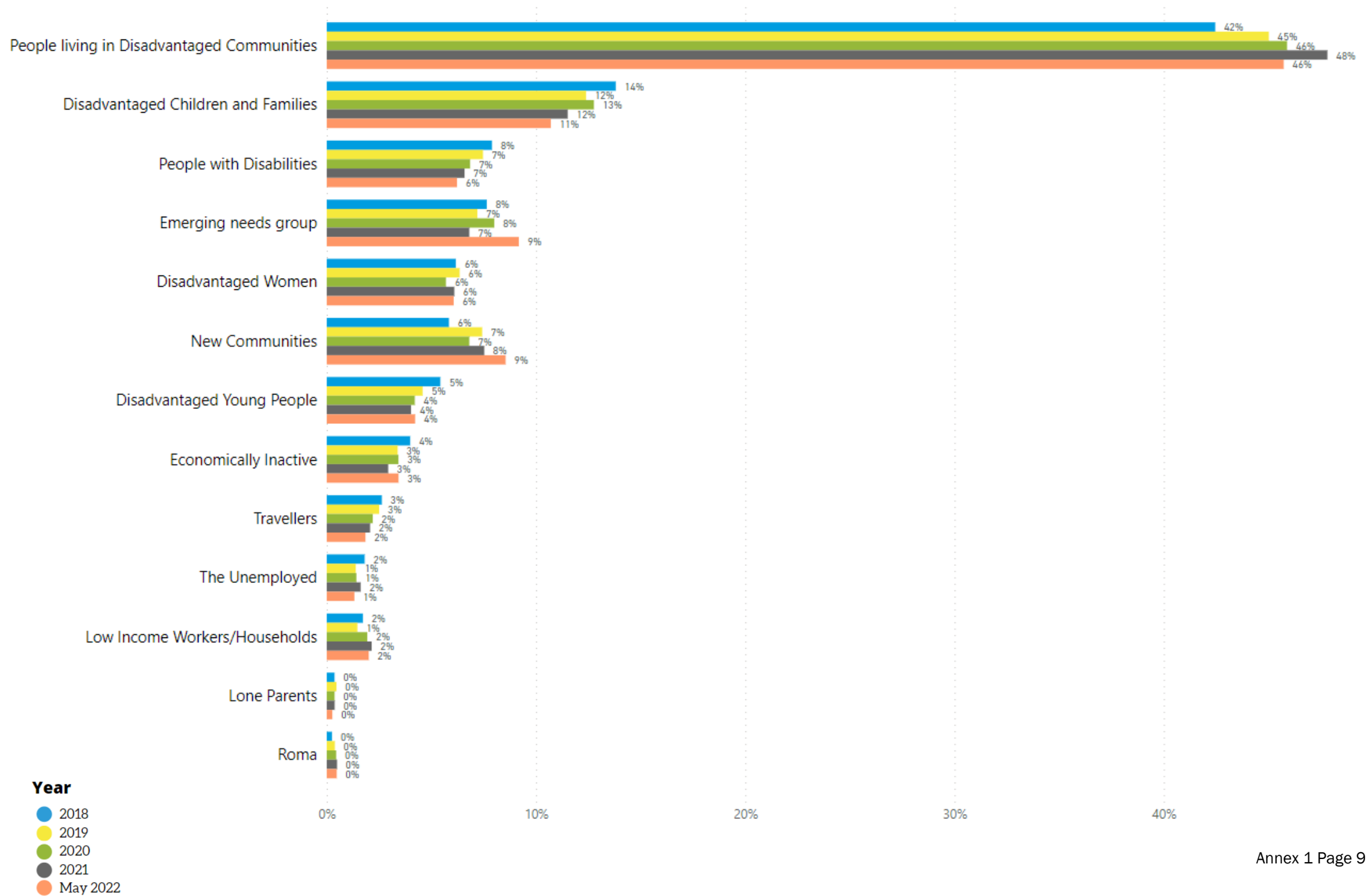


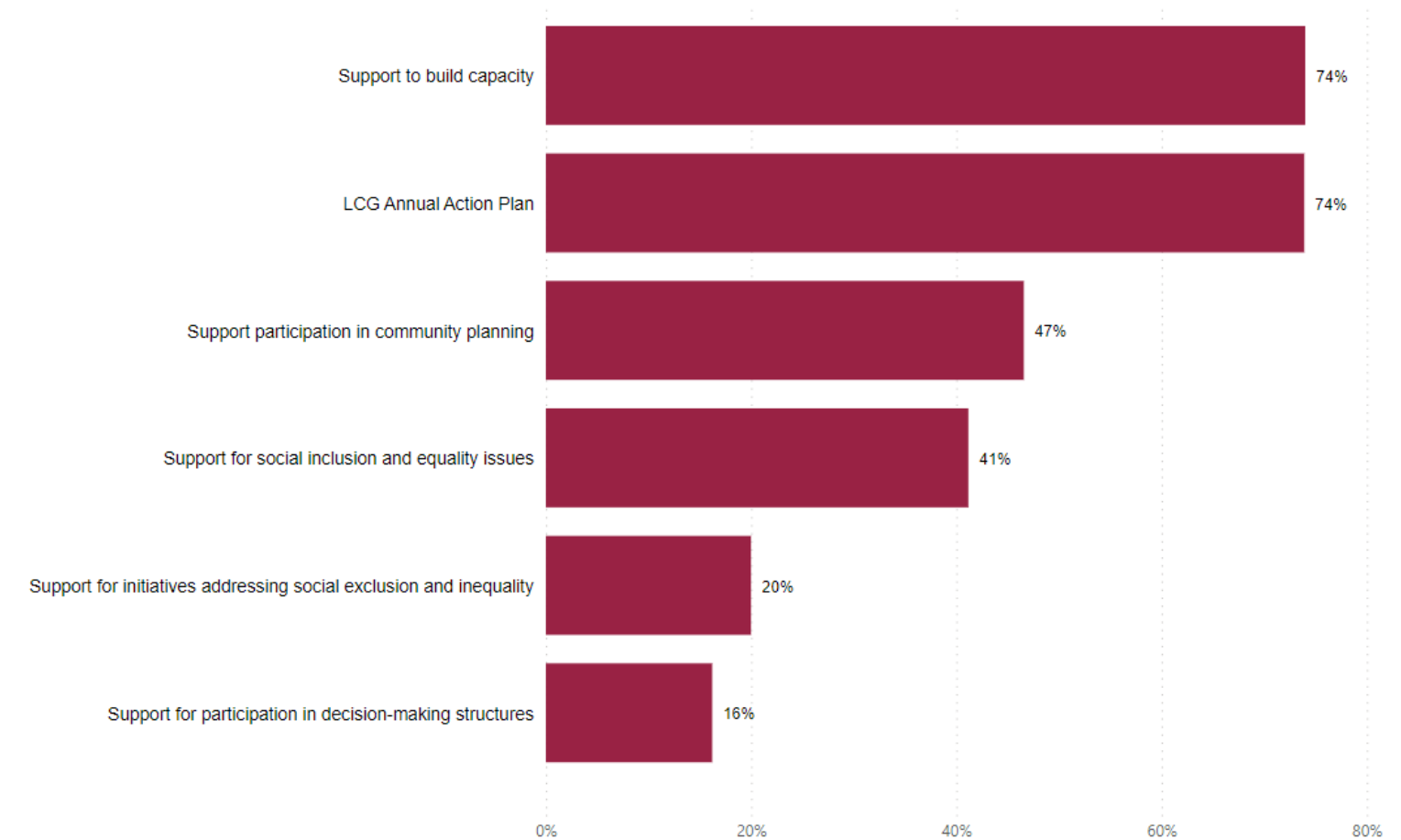
Figure 11 Total LCGs on the 2018 – May 2022 caseloads at national level, by primary target group

Figure 12 LCGs on the caseload to date at national level, by type of interventions received





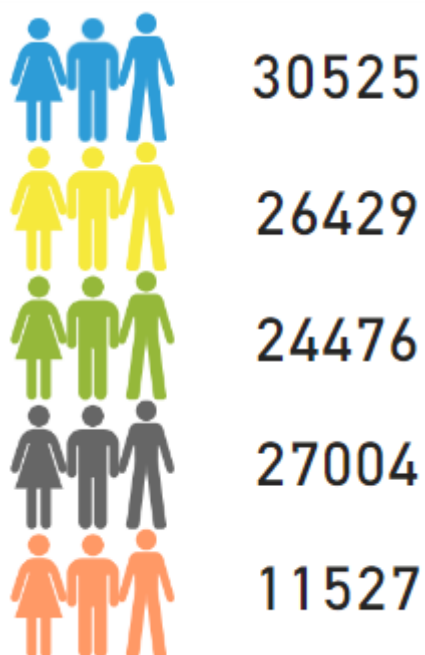

Figure 14 Events each year at national level, by type of event

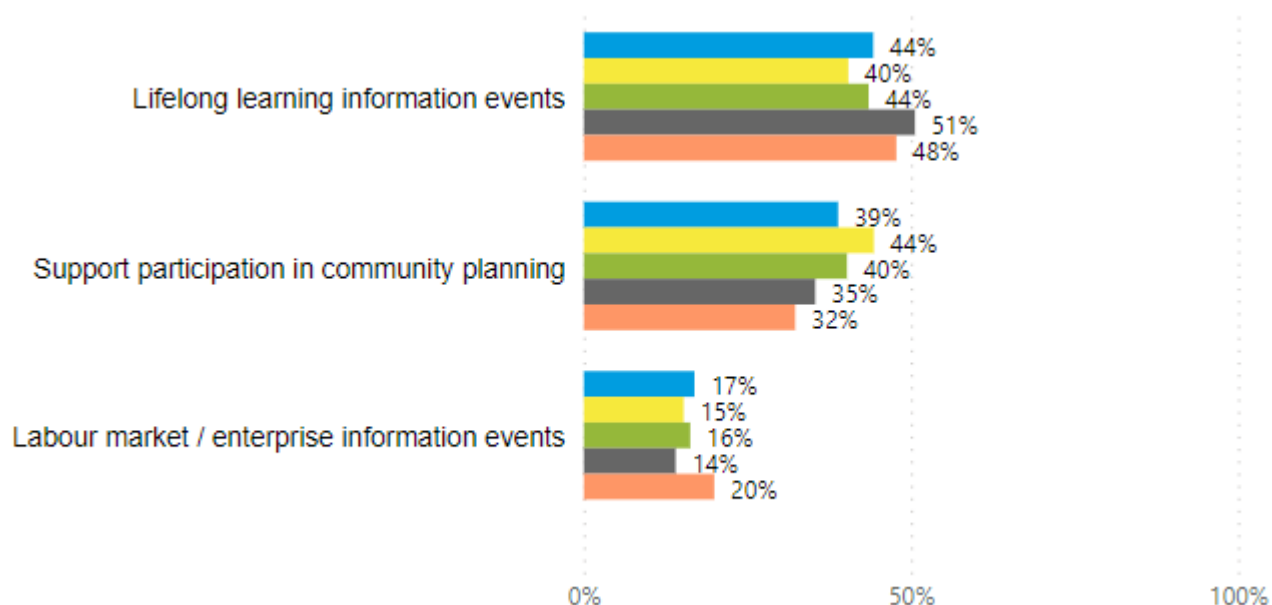
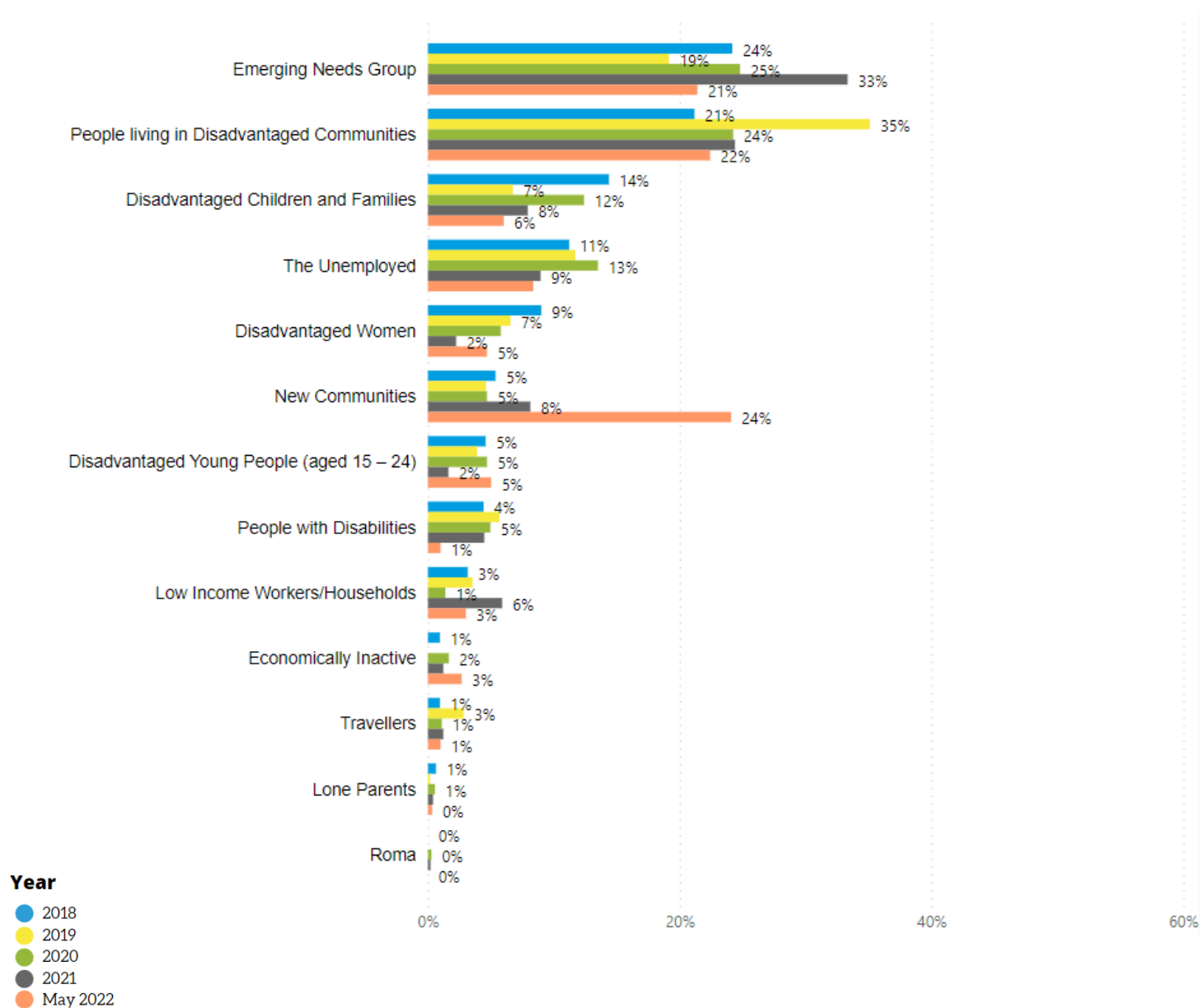


Figure 15 Events each year at national level, by primary target group





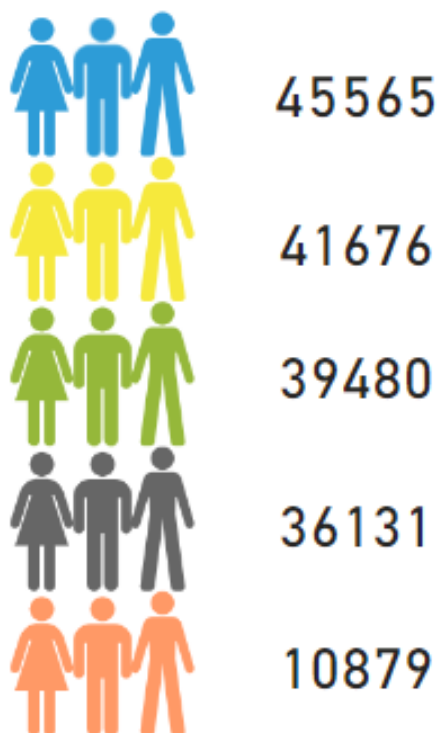

Figure 17 Activities each year at national level, by primary target group

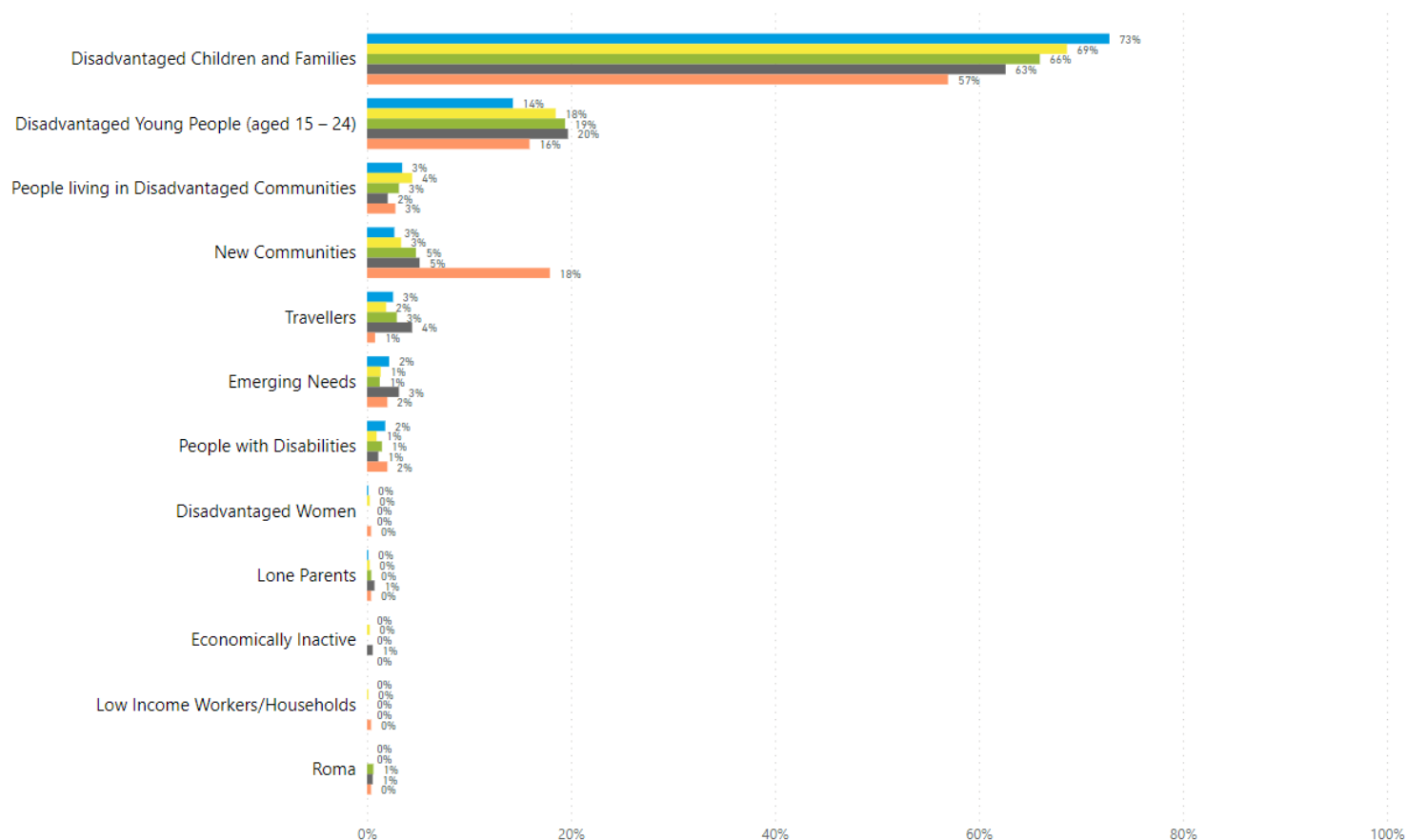
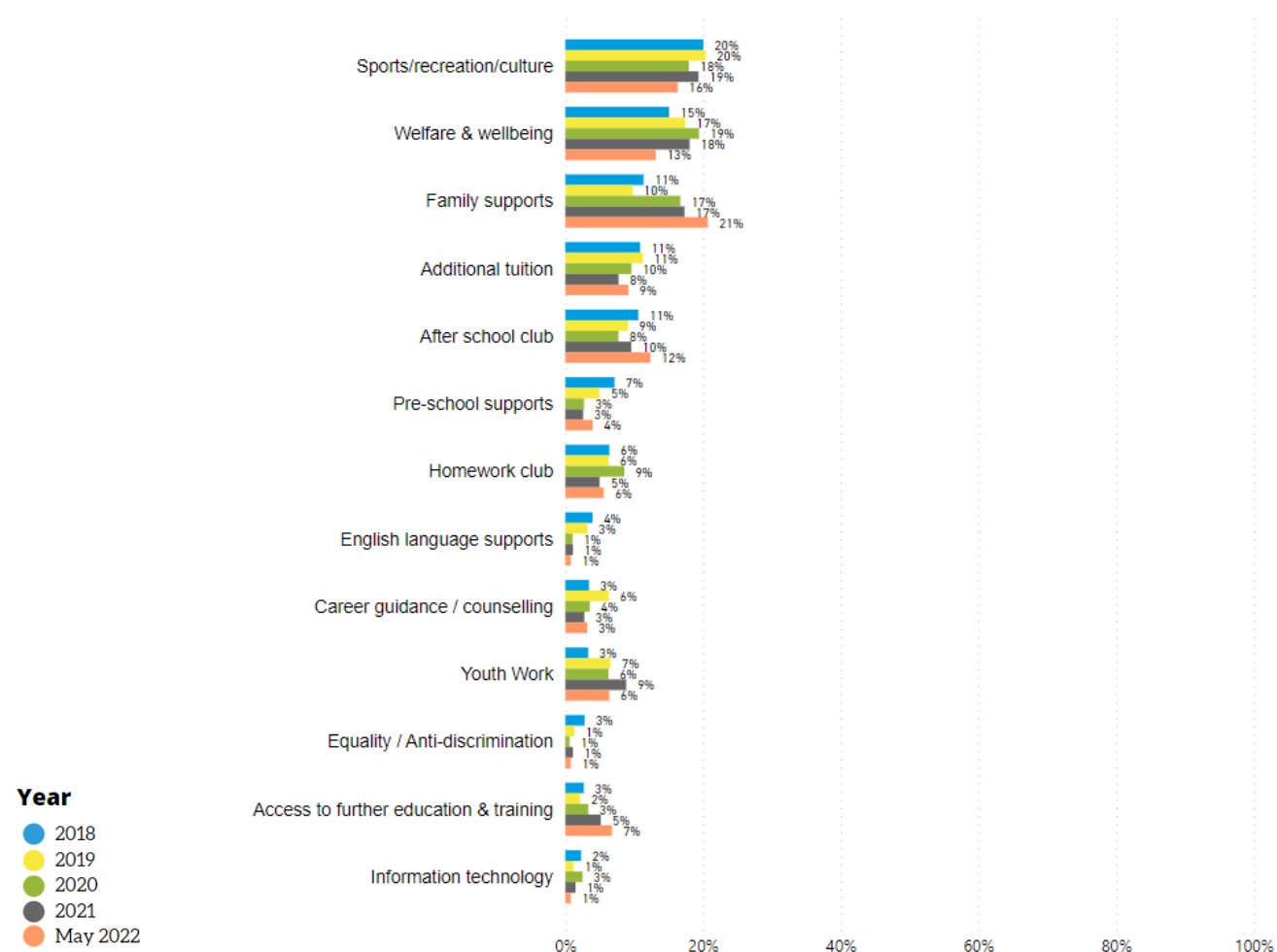


Figure 18 Activities each year at national level, by type

Note: Upon review of the national IRIS data, it was noted that there are inconsistencies with the reporting of Ukrainian supports. This is likely because of a variety of reasons, such as a limited time frame between issuing of the Ukrainian guidance for recording on IRIS as well the time constraints faced by LDCs due to the urgent need to provide supports to Ukrainians within the Lot. For this reason, it is acknowledged that this report does not necessarily present a full representation of SICAP work with Ukrainians. For a fuller picture of the supports provided to mid-year, please refer to the action progress report. As the data processes for supports to Ukrainians become more embedded throughout the year, it is anticipated that there will be a more comprehensive picture of the SICAP supports provided by the end of the year.

Children and Families supported by SICAP: includes children and young people (under 18 years of age) who belong to a SICAP target group and who are engaged with SICAP through their school and/or local activities. They can be supported either on their own or as part of a family intervention, involving their parents and guardians. They do not need to be registered to SICAP to participate in these activities.

Event attendees supported by SICAP: are beneficiaries who participate in specific Goal 1 community engagement activities (G1-1:1) or Goal 2 information events e.g. a jobs fair. They do not need to be registered to SICAP to participate in these events. While non-caseload events should target SICAP target groups, not all attendees need to belong to a target group. Where possible, only the number of people belonging to the SICAP target group should be reported.

Individuals supported by SICAP: people who are registered with the programme must be at least 15 years of age and a member of one of the SICAP target groups. In order to be counted as part of the SICAP caseload for a particular period, the individual must have received at least two separate one-to-one interventions and agreed a Personal Action Plan. Additionally, at least one of these interventions must be carried out in person (i.e. face-to-face) and the initial registration meeting is not counted.

LDC Collaborations: are formal or informal arrangements between LDCs and other relevant stakeholders e.g. statutory sector or community organisations, whereby they agree to work together strategically to address a specific social inclusion issue(s).

Local Community Groups (LCGs) supported by SICAP: formal and informal groups that work on a wide range of social inclusion or equality issues at community level and/or address the needs of a SICAP target group. An LCG must have received at least two separate interventions and agreed an Annual Support Plan. The initial registration meeting is not counted as an intervention.

My Journey: Distanced Travelled Tool (DTT): is a validated tool which measures soft skills relevant to employment, education and training, and personal development. It supports service users and staff to work together to identify personal goals and to show progress on these over time. My Journey is a quick and easy questionnaire, and can be used in individual and group settings. It is designed for repeat use to show what has changed.

Social Enterprises (SEs) supported by SICAP: A Social Enterprise is an enterprise whose objective is to achieve a social, societal or environmental impact, rather than maximising profit for its owners or shareholders. It pursues its objectives by trading on an ongoing basis through the provision of goods and/or services, and by reinvesting surpluses into achieving social objectives. It is governed in a fully accountable and transparent manner and is independent of the public sector. If dissolved, it should transfer its assets to another organisation with a similar mission. Social Enterprises supported by SICAP must provide services to SICAP target groups/in disadvantaged communities, or employ or provide training to SICAP target groups to be eligible for support.
